 - be a qualified public entity (governmental entities)
 - or an IRS recognized 501(c)(3) in good standing with the IRS,

 - Leverage

- Programs and/or services that demonstrate a positive impact on our community.

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Apply for Funding

- Letters of Intent (LOIs) and Applications are submitted via the Knapp Community Care Foundation (KCCF) Online Grant System at www.communitycare.today.
- Click on “apply for a grant”
- Create an account to begin the registration process
- For those that have been funded, you may reset your password or use the previous password.

Funding Cycle Process

- **Letter of Intent (LOI).** (Applicants have 3 weeks to prepare and submit LOI)
- **LOI review** (Staff reviews LOI within 1 – 2 weeks)
- **Application.** If LOI is approved, entities are assigned an application (Applicants have 6 weeks to prepare and submit application)
- **Application review** (KCCF Staff and Grant Committee review applications)
- **Notice of award**



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Collaborative Planning Grants

**Grants intended to encourage
nonprofit leaders and governmental entities
to explore a range of formal
collaborations rooted in maximum impact
with minimal overlap**

Collaborative Planning Grants

Each grant must:

- address Diabetes and/or Obesity issues
- Include at a minimum three (3) or more partners to work towards a formalized collaborative project
- have a lead entity that will be responsible for financial reports and outcomes

Financial Information

- Financial audits are **required** if an organization's total annual budget is \$500,000.00 or more
- Financial reviews are **acceptable** on a case by case basis
- 990s (GuideStar)
- Leverage
